ACT INSTRUCTIONS FOR <u>PRIVATE</u> SCHOOLED STUDENTS Requesting Accommodations for Diabetes

The following information was provided by ACT in May 2017. Use this process if your student is in <u>private</u> school.

- 1. <u>After</u> the student registers for future test dates, the school should receive a request from the student for accommodations.
 - The student should provide the school counselor with the Student Registration details. The student initiates this.
- 2. Student should provide the school counselor the ACT ID number
- 3. The school should sign into or create an account (https://readiness.act.org) in the Test Accessibility and Accommodations System (TAA).
- 4. Requests must be submitted through TAA by the published late registration deadlines for the student's preferred test date.
 - Refer to the ACT website for ACT test dates and deadlines. <u>http://www.act.org/content/act/en/products-and-services/the-act/taking-the-test.html</u>
- 5. Upon receiving the Accommodations Decision Notification, the **school** counselor **must notify the student** as they will not receive notification from ACT.
- 6. Once ACT has all the documents, allow a couple of weeks for the ACT Analyst to review your case.
- 7. Prior to your test date, ACT will send you the Accommodations Decision Notification regarding the approval for accommodations.

T1ToGo Tip: Just prior to the test, always verify <u>again</u> that the accommodations for the test are in place at that testing location. Take your accommodation paperwork to the test facility.
