



Post-Secondary Testing/Class Accommodations for Type 1 Diabetic Students

Standardized tests are administered to measure college readiness and high school achievement.

- ❑ Standardized tests for college readiness are classified as post-secondary.
 - ❑ Learn more at [T1ToGo's AP SAT ACT Page](#).
- ❑ Accommodations must be approved by the testing organization.
 - ❑ Post-secondary is not covered under same laws for K-12th.
 - ❑ Post-secondary education is voluntary and only provides for FAIR accommodations under ADA and the Rehabilitation Act.
 - ❑ Students must **self-initiate** for accommodations.
 - ❑ Public school counselors assist with accommodation approvals.
 - ❑ **Always check with your school on their process!**

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❑ Dual-Credit Classes

- ❑ Register with the college administering the class for student disability services. This is often a local community college.
 - ❑ Check directly with the college's **Student Disability Services**.
 - ❑ If local, attend an introduction to disability services meeting with the college. These are great introductions to life at college while still in parental care.
 - ❑ Learn differences between K-12th vs. college.
 - ❑ Communicate with high school administering the class.
 - ❑ Services may be needed for accommodations/excess absences.
 - ❑ Classes are administered in high school setting but college rules may apply for absences.
 - ❑ Dual-credit class criteria differ by class & college.
 - ❑ Registration with disability services must be done PRIOR to needing accommodations or services.
 - ❑ Services and accommodations are not retroactive.
 - ❑ Learn about your state's **Dropped Course Limit** for college.

❑ Tips to assist with accommodations

❑ 504 Plans

- ❑ An existing 504 Plan process may meet the criteria for confirming disability criteria for accommodations.
 - ❑ Eliminates additional disability documentation.
 - ❑ Speeds up accommodation process
- ❑ Provide detailed testing accommodations in your 504 plan.
 - ❑ Minimum/maximum BG testing range for testing
 - ❑ CGMs, Pumps, Phones, Share Devices, Watches

❑ Plan for accommodations process **6 months** in advance.

- ❑ Testing organizations may take up to **2 months** for accommodation approval process.
- ❑ Allow extra time for school administration process.
 - ❑ Take into account school holidays.
- ❑ Make note of testing organizations accommodations test date deadlines and plan accordingly.
 - ❑ Each test date has an accommodation request deadline.



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
